

Extreme Cities: The Peril and Promise of Urban Life in the Age of Climate Change (2017)

To celebrate the 25th anniversary of the RPP designation in Ontario, OPPI is hosting a province-wide book club meetup during the OPPI19: Beyond25 Conference this October. The

conference, Facing Change and Guiding Ontario into the Next Quarter Century, will explore three key issues: Climate Change, Uneven Growth and Technology.

As a perfect primer to climate change conversations, the Eastern District Book Club will partner with OPPI's province-wide pilot club to read Ashley Dawson's *Extreme Cities*. While Dawson's investigation asks how and where climate change will most impact our lives, OPPI19: Beyond25 challenges planners with the following questions:

- What impacts of climate change influence policy?
- How can good climate change policies align with, balance or improve other policies or planning priorities?
- What does good climate change policy look like?
- In what ways do climate change research, climate change policy and climate change implementation influence one another?
- How can we best connect research and practice?

Leading up to the Conference meetup in Toronto during October 1-3, 2019, we invite you to ponder and discuss these questions and more by visiting the OPPI Book Club's LinkedIn page. Oak Ridges District

Source Water Protection Workshop and Site Tour Caledon. Please take note of the following change in time!

Hosted in Caledon by the Region of Peel in collaboration with the OPPI Oak Ridges District, this half-day session is designed to provide interested planners with an "in the field" opportunity to understand the integrated nature of Ontario's multi-barrier approach to the protection of drinking water sources and the associated implementation of source protection plans that ensure safe and sustainable drinking water from source to tap.



This session will involve an interactive, behind-the-scenes visit to three groundwater treatment facilities owned and operated by the Region of Peel in the Town of Caledon. Participants will hear directly from technical staff about the facility's operation to comply with the requirements under the Safe Drinking Water Act, 2002. Attendees will also be given the opportunity to walk the boundaries of the most vulnerable areas as identified through the requirements outlined in the Clean Water Act, 2006 and visualize the scope of the Wellhead Protection Areas.

Region of Peel, Town of Caledon and Credit Valley – Toronto and Region – Central Lake Ontario (CTC) Source Protection Staff will address the broad array of policies from locally applicable Source Protection Plans which work collaboratively with Provincial Plans to protect the groundwater supplies servicing residents in this rural community.

Attendees will have the opportunity to acquire knowledge which will enhance their day-to-day

responsibilities, as well as liaise with colleagues.

Tour Safety:

This event is limited to 15 registrants for safety reasons.

The tour involves walking outdoors on uneven terrain and through an industrial facility. For safety reasons, all participants **must wear steel toe boots**. Long pants are also required. Personal protective equipment (hardhats and reflective vests) will be provided at the plant and must be worn by all participants. In addition, all participants will be required to sign a Waiver of Liability.

Additional safety information and waivers will be provided to registered participants closer to the event date. Participants will be responsible for their transportation between sites, with parking will be available at each.

Please note: Plant staff reserve the right to cancel the tour in the event of inclement weather, power outages or other operational factors/plant emergency.


